

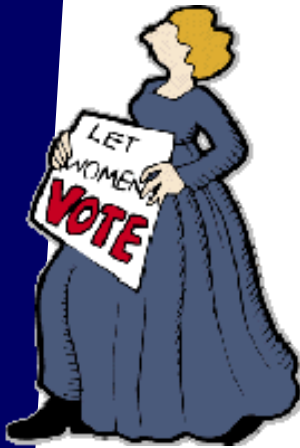


Sunday Concert:

Wednesday, Sept. 13 7PM

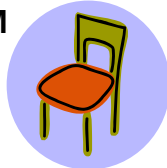

Preschool Storytime

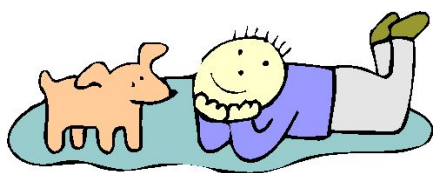

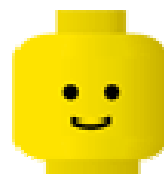
